Q.

Do you have to wait until semester two to volunteer?

A.

No. OT PEP students who are looking to volunteer with MONSU for their studies in semester two are encouraged to join us in semester one. We believe engaging in the program early will allow you to find your feet, train your skills, and feel more a part of the team.





Q.

Will any of my hours in semester one contribute to my 35 hours for OCC1042?

A.

Yes. Those students successful in transitioning into the OT PEP volunteering program in semester two who volunteered in semester one will be entitled to add up to 5 hours of their completed volunteering total hours to their total required hours for OCC1042.

Q.

The requirements for OCC1042 and MONSU Peninsula volunteering are different. Do I need to have all my paperwork of OCC1042 sorted to volunteer with MONSU Peninsula if I intend to apply for the OT PEP program in semester two?

A.

Fortunately, no. If you would like to volunteer with MONSU Peninsula in semester one, you only need to complete your Working With Children Check and Food Handlers certification.



Q.

Do all of my volunteer hours with MONSU Peninsula contribute to the required 35 hours for OCC1042?

A.

Mostly yes. As part of your role in semester two, you will be required to engage publicly for the hours to count. This means at least one hour of your shift must be during an event. Volunteering in the community garden and prepping for Food Co-op Cafe do not contribute to your OCC1042 hours. These hours, however, will still add to your MONSU Peninsula hours, so you will continue to earn rewards from us.

Q.

Wait a minute! Are you telling me I can still claim all the rewards other MONSU Peninsula volunteers earn?

A.

You're a MONSU volunteer, aren't you? Of course you can claim the same rewards!
