Q.

Will any of my hours in semester one contribute to my 35 hours for OCC1042 PEP?

A.

Yes. If students transition into the OCC1042 PEP Program in semester two up to 5 hours of MONSU volunteering can contribute towards your OCC1042 total.





Q.

Can I apply for OCC1042 PEP program if I am already volunteering with MONSU Peninsula?

A.

Of course you can. If you didn't select OCC1042 as one of your opportunities, just contact the Student Experience Coordinator when the EOI is released. Eligible MONSU volunteers may be able to transition into our OCC1042 PEP program. If you are not able to transition, there are a wide range of OCC1042 PEP opportunities available to further develop your OT skills. We encourage you to take advantage of what's on offer.

Q.

The requirements for OCC1042 PEP and MONSU Peninsula volunteering are different. Do I need to have all my paperwork of OCC1042 sorted to volunteer with MONSU Peninsula if I intend to apply for the OT PEP program in semester two?

A.

For students volunteering in semester one, you only need to meet the requirements outlined by MONSU Peninsula (Working With Children Check, current Monash Student, and Food Handlers certification). In order for you to transition into the OCC1042 PEP program with MONSU in semester two, you will need to comply with the OT course requirements outlined in OCC1011 and OCC1042 to be successful.



Q.

Do all of my volunteer hours with MONSU Peninsula contribute to the required 35 hours for OCC1042?

A.

For the most part. As part of your role in semester two you will be required to engage publicly for the hours to count. This means **at least one hour** of your shift must be during an event. Volunteering in the community garden and prepping for Food Co-op Cafe do not contribute to your OCC1042 PEP hours. These hours, however, will still add to your MONSU Peninsula hours, so you will continue to earn rewards from us.

Q.

Wait a minute! Are you telling me I can still claim all the rewards other MONSU Peninsula volunteers earn?

A.

You're a MONSU volunteer, aren't you? Of course you can claim the same rewards! We will even send you a little something on your birthday.
